

The Virginia Deer Hunter's Association Scholarship Program Applicant / Student Instruction Sheet

Purpose:

To encourage and promote wildlife conservation and to recruit the next generation of wildlife professionals for the Commonwealth of Virginia and beyond, The Virginia Deer Hunter's Association provides undergraduate and graduate-level grants-in-aid in order to support research efforts. Awards can be used to purchase equipment and supplies or to support research related travel costs, and for graduate student awards to provide financial supplements or additions to research stipends. Projects in Virginia, the Southeast and Mid-Atlantic region that investigate white-tailed deer ecology and habitat management or those that investigate issues of concern to sportsmen are encouraged; however, meritorious submissions on other terrestrial wildlife species, game or non-game are welcome.

<u>Eligibility</u>:

- Students must be pursuing a degree at an accredited institution of higher education (i.e. Community College, Technical College, College or University or be participants in the DGIF Internship Program)
- Students must support the preservation of the hunting tradition.
- Students must demonstrate ability as a leader among his or her peers.
- Students must submit an essay exhibiting dedication to conservation (see application).
- Three letters of recommendation must be attached to the application (i.e. teacher, counselor, community leader)
- Applicants must submit applications to Scholarship Committee by May 31, 2016. Employees and Board Members of the VDHA and their family members are not eligible to participate in the program.

Selection Process:

Applicants will submit applicant names and qualifications on an official VDHA scholarship application, along with required attachments to the Scholarship Committee by May31, 2016.

Scholarship Levels:

Five Scholarship winners will receive up to \$1,000.00. One Scholarship winner will receive up to \$2,500.00.

Disbursement of Funds:

Students may use their scholarship at any accredited institution of higher education (Community College, Technical College, College or University).

The VDHA will work with the student and the college financial aid officers in determining the payee when the check is issued. This will ensure the greater benefit to the recipient and avoid violation of eligibility requirements.
